Contributions from a Political Committee permitted up to \$7,500

Ad book purchases: Up to \$250 for a business entity and up to \$50 for a union

Lobbyists, State Contractors and their immediate family may not contribute.

The Working Families Campaign Committee is the State Central Committee of the Working Families Party and is permitted to make "organizational expenditures" in support of endorsed candidates up to \$7,500 for a State Senate candidate and up to \$3,500 for a State Representative candidate
